MONDAY, JANUARY 19

GOD FIRST IN MY HOUSE

“But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.”

Joshua 24:15 (NKJV)

DEVOTIONAL

Your home is your first ministry. Before God ever asks you to lead, serve, or build anything else, He calls you to honor Him inside your own house. Joshua's declaration was not emotional—it was intentional. He didn't wait for his family to decide; he set the standard: *“As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.”*

DAY 12

MONDAY, JANUARY 19

Every family has battles. Every home has challenges. But consecration is a reminder that God doesn't just save individuals—He restores households. He heals marriages. He strengthens parents. DAY 13

TUESDAY, JANUARY 20

BUILDING A GOD-FIRST HOUSE

“Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it...”

Psalm 127:1 (NKJV)

DEVOTIONAL

Every household is built on something—tradition, habits, personalities, pressure, or pain. But Scripture reminds us that unless the Lord Himself is the builder, our best efforts become exhausting and empty. A God-first home is not created through human strength; it is constructed through divine involvement.

DAY 13

TUESDAY, JANUARY 20

God doesn't just bless homes—He builds them. When you bring God into the foundation of your house, everything else rests on stability instead of stress. Peace multiplies. Wisdom flows. Relationships strengthen. Burdens lift. His presence becomes the unseen structure holding everything together.

Many families struggle not because of lack of love, but because of lack of spiritual order. When God isn't the builder, people take on burdens they were never meant to carry. Arguments increase. Pressure rises. Weariness sets in. But when God takes His rightful place, the atmosphere shifts from chaos to calm and from heaviness to hope.

DAY 14

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 21

PEACE IN THE HOUSE

“Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts...”

Colossians 3:15 (NIV)

DEVOTIONAL

Peace is not the absence of problems—it is the presence of Christ ruling in the atmosphere of your home. Households today face pressure from every angle: work, finances, school, marriage dynamics, blended family transitions, conflict, illness, and emotional strain. But Paul reminds us that the peace of Christ can become the ruling authority inside your walls.

DAY 14

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 21

Peace doesn't enter a home automatically; it is invited, protected, and practiced. It grows where there is forgiveness, humility, gentleness, and grace. It fades where there is pride, anger, silence, or unresolved tension. Peace leaves when people fight for control instead of fighting for unity.

A God-first home refuses to allow chaos to rule. Peace becomes the umpire that settles disputes. Peace becomes the guardian that filters attitudes. Peace becomes the atmosphere that nurtures children, strengthens marriages, and calms anxious thoughts.

This week, commit to being a peace-carrier in your home. Not a peacekeeper who avoids conversations, but a peacemaker who approaches them with love. When Christ rules your heart, His peace can rule your house.

REFLECTION

What is one practical step you can take to bring more peace into your home today?

PRAYER

DAY 15

THURSDAY, JANUARY 22

HOUSEHOLD SALVATION

“Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house.”

Acts 16:31 (KJV)

DEVOTIONAL

God’s heart has always included households—not just individuals. When Paul told the jailer, “You and your house shall be saved,” he revealed a truth often forgotten: God desires to save families, not just people. He wants spouses, children, grandchildren, siblings, and generations to know Him.

DAY 15

THURSDAY, JANUARY 22

Sometimes the greatest burden believers carry is the spiritual condition of their loved ones. You may have unsaved family members, wayward children, or relatives trapped in cycles of addiction, anger, or unbelief. But today's Scripture reminds you that salvation is not only possible—it is promised.

Household salvation doesn't mean force—it means faith. It means living the gospel in front of your family with love, patience, integrity, and prayer. It means believing that the Holy Spirit is working behind the scenes, softening hearts and opening eyes. It means trusting God's timing, even when progress seems slow.

Do not give up on your family. God hasn't. He hears every prayer, sees every tear, and honors every seed you've sown. Believe again. Pray again. Declare again. Your home is not beyond His reach.

DAY 15

THURSDAY, JANUARY 22

REFLECTION

Who in your family are you believing God to save—and will you pray for them today?

PRAYER

Lord, I lift my family to You. Save, heal, deliver, and restore every household member. Break every chain, open every heart, and draw them to Christ. Let my home experience Your saving power. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 16

FRIDAY, JANUARY 23

THE HOUSE GOD PROTECTS

“My people will live in peaceful dwelling places, in secure homes, in undisturbed places of rest.”

Isaiah 32:18 (NIV)

DEVOTIONAL

God intends for your home to be more than a place where you sleep—it is meant to be a sanctuary. A place of safety. A place of peace. A place of rest. A place where His presence dwells and His protection surrounds every room.

DAY 16

FRIDAY, JANUARY 23

Isaiah gives a prophetic picture of God's desire for His people: peaceful dwelling places, secure homes, and undisturbed rest. This doesn't mean the absence of battles; it means divine protection through the battles. It means that even when chaos hits the world, your home remains covered.

Spiritual warfare often targets the home: conflict, confusion, division, fear, worry, and attacks on unity. But God promises protection—when He is first. A God-first home is hard for the enemy to infiltrate because the covering is strong, the atmosphere is guarded, and the Word is active.

As Week 3 closes, declare God's protection over your house. Pray over your doors, your rooms, your children, your spouse, your boundaries, and your peace. Your home is not vulnerable—it is covered by the hand of God.

REFLECTION

Where do you need God's protection, covering, or peace in your home?

“Cover the house with Your love, and renew a sense of safety within me.”

PRAYER
